This commission is composed of representatives from administrative departments (Federal Ministries and Provincial authorities), unions and management, science and non-government organizations (NGOs)].

The first version of this report was provided by Provincial authorities, which involved local nature protection authorities and relevant persons. The final version of this questionnaire was approved by the Austrian National Biodiversity Commission before it was sent to SCBD.

# Please provide information on any particular circumstances in your country that are relevant to understanding the answers to the questions in this report

A wide range of activities is taking place in Austria in the realm of conserving and sustainably using biological diversity. In Austria, a number of institutions are involved in implementing the Convention due to divided jurisdiction and competences between Federal and Provincial authorities. A broad range of laws governs the various facets of protecting and sustainably using biodiversity, a term which has not been generally incorporated into the Austrian legal system. There are 9 Federal Provinces in Austria. Provincial laws relevant to the Convention on Biological Diversity are sometimes different. Beyond these domestic laws, certain European Union regulations are also relevant to the Convention on Biological Diversity.

In addition, research institutions, industry, non-governmental organizations and private persons are very active in this sector. Nonetheless, the "Red Lists" of endangered species continue to grow.

The COP has established programmes of work that respond to a number of Articles. Please identify the relative priority accorded to each theme and the adequacy of resources. This will allow subsequent information on implementation of each Article to be put into context. There are other questions on implementation of the programmes of work at the end of these guidelines.

Different key issues and questions are dealt with in appropriate and popular ways.

There is a "Day of Biodiversity", organised as a model, to be "copied" by different regions, there are seminars and excursions for journalists, a "mobile research station" for children in a bus, all kinds of brochures and publications for the public as well as specific targets, collection of projects and models of good practice, special issues like "Biodiversity, food production and landscape" in cooperation with first class cooks in a program called "Gourmets for Nature" etc. The projects and seminars are carried out in 2001, the publications are published in 2002.

#### 1995: Establishment of the "National Commission on Biodiversity"

As soon as the Austrian Government ratified the convention our work began to determine measures required to meet the obligations of the convention.

Recognizing the legislative and divided responsibilities for biodiversity in Austria a "National Commission on Biodiversity" was set up by the Ministry responsible for the Environment, which should

- guide our efforts on implementing the CBD
- facilitate coordination & cooperation in the many activities and programs in the field of biodiversity
- and play an important platform for information exchange on various issues related to biodiversity

This Commission is composed of representatives of

- Administrative Authorities (Federal Ministries, Provincial Governments)
- Public & Private Interest Groups (Landowner Associations, Chamber of Commerce,...)
- Scientists (Universities, Austrian Academy of Science, Natural History Museum,....)
- and last but not least representatives from NGOs (WWF Austria, Greenpeace, BirdLife, ....), which are important partners also in disseminating information, creating awareness and influencing public behaviour and mediating our goals.

In 1997 the National Commission elaborated the first **National Report** of Austria to the Convention on Biological Diversity.

Responding to one of the key obligations for parties, the "**National Strategy**" to govern its implementation has been developed by the National Biodiversity Commission. The Austrian Government endorsed this strategy in 1998. An evaluation of this strategy is taking place.
